## PUBLIC NOTICE

## Subject: Initiation of Proceedings for Cancellation of Registration of Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) for False Declaration in Form D-2 under Drone Rules, 2021

It has come to the notice of The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) that certain entities are knowingly/unknowingly misusing the self-generation of Unique Identification Numbers (UINs) of illegally imported Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) for registration on the **Digital Sky platform/ e-GCA portal** of DGCA. These UINs have been identified & found to contain **false declarations/ details in Form D-2**, specifically:

- 1. **Incorrect classification** of drones under the "**Model RPAS**" sub-category, whereas the drones are not intended solely for educational, research, design, testing or recreational purpose only, as defined under the Drone Rules, 2021; and
- 2. The registered UAS were manufactured outside India and were imported without prior import authorization, in contravention of import regulations under the Drone Rules and the applicable guidelines of the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) Notification No. 54/2015-20 dated 09.02.2022.

It is reiterated that vide the aforementioned DGFT notification import of drones in Completely-Built-Up (CBU), Semi-Knocked-Down (SKD) or Completely-Knocked-Down (CKD) form is "Prohibited" with exceptions provided for R&D, Defence & Security purpose and prior approval/import authorization from DGFT is mandatory. Any registration of UAS imported in violation of these provisions constitutes a serious regulatory breach.

These false declarations amount to **misrepresentation** and are in **violation of the Drone Rules, 2021**, making the registrations liable for suspension/ cancellation under **Rule 53**.

Before proceeding with cancellation, the DGCA will provide an **opportunity of being heard** to the concerned individuals/entities. DGCA is in the process of suspension/ cancellation of identified UINs. Affected persons may submit their **written explanation** along with supporting documents [(a) Purchase details invoice, (b) DGFT permission in case of import/ foreign made UAS, (c) Weighing certificate from NABL accredited lab, (d) Declaration on letter head in case of

{(i). Central/State/UT government (ii). Education institution recognized by Central/State/UT government, (iii). Start-ups recognized by DPIIT with certificate proof, (iv). Authorized Testing Agencies (ATE), (v). UAS manufacturer having GSTIN}, (e) Declaration of candidate given the individual ID & address proof, (f) Pictures of Drone including manufacturer data plate] to justify the accuracy of their registration and address the discrepancies noted. To submit representations, affected person may contact the Drone Directorate at <a href="mailto:drone.dgca@gov.in">drone.dgca@gov.in</a> with subject "Response to Public Notice dated 12 August 2025 – False Declaration in Form D-2".

Failure to respond within one month from the date of publication of this Public Notice may result in cancellation of the UAS registration without further notice.

Operating any drone with a suspended/ cancelled registration is strictly prohibited and may lead to **penal action under the Drone Rules**, **2021 and the Aircraft Act**, **1934**, including legal proceedings.

This notice is issued in the interest of national security, public safety, and the integrity of civil aviation regulation.
